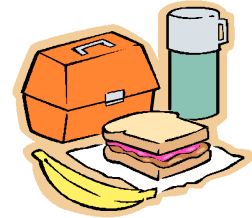

- September 8, 2009 **OUTLIERS: The Story of Success** by Malcolm Gladwell - *This book combines interesting biographies with common sense observations. It leaves you thinking about your own life and the future of loved ones.* Our presenter is **Tony Leon**, retired columnist, writer and editor at The Reporter, a member of Mensa and a U.S. Army veteran.
- October 13, 2009 **DON'T FORGET TO WAVE** by Larry Cooper - *Declining population in rural America presents a difficult future for many small town businesses and small, rural schools. This is seen through eight-man football in Iowa and six-man football in Nebraska where the changing job opportunities are very evident.* Our reviewer is **Larry Cooper**, a retired Fond du Lac social studies teacher, who attended schools in rural Wisconsin.
- November 10, 2009 **I KNOW THIS MUCH IS TRUE** by Wally Lamb - *Lamb narrates an epic saga centered on the lives of identical twins. One brother develops debilitating schizophrenia and the other, who does not, struggles with his emotional survival.* Our reviewer, **Mary Ellen McMeen**, is retired from the Department of Community Programs and the current vice president of the FdL Chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness.
- January 12, 2010 **POWER THROUGH REPOSE (1891)** by Annie Payson Call - *At the turn of the last century this author was wildly popular but now almost forgotten. Championed by philosopher and pioneering psychologist, William James, Call was a self taught intuitive guide to practical thinking.* **Rev. Jack Stubbs**, an avid reader and pastor of Salem United Methodist Church since 2008 will be our reviewer.
- February 9, 2010 **COUNTRY OF MY SKULL** by Antjie Krog - *After a century of colonialism and an evolving policy of apartheid, South Africa officially ended apartheid in 1990. How can a Truth and Reconciliation Commission come to terms with the horrendous atrocities committed, eventually by both whites and blacks?* **Jill Stiemsma**, our presenter, a Sociology and Ethics instructor at Moraine Park Technical College was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship to study in Swaziland, Botswana, and South Africa in 2003.
- March 9, 2010 **THE DANGEROUS BOOK FOR BOYS** by Hal and Conn Iggulden captures the essence of boyhood of years gone by. *It is an engaging and entertaining guide book for boys.* **THE DARING BOOK FOR GIRLS** by Andrea J Buchanan and Miriam Peskowitz is the manual for everything that girls need to know. *It is every girl's invitation to adventure.* **Marianne Niles**, a licensed psychologist for FdL County Dept. of Community Programs and for Green Lake County Dept. of Health and Human Services will review these **Fond du Lac Reads!** selections.
- April 13, 2010 **WOLF HALL** by Hilary Mantel – *Through the rise of Thomas Cromwell to power in Henry VIII's England, Mantel lets us know the other Thomases in the king's life. The impact of religious beliefs on government, the relationship of advisors to leaders, the evolution of individual rights, the nature of sovereignty-all are rich topics for discussion, concerning England then or the world now, and all are food for thought.* Mary Thompson Fingerhut, a retired high school history and English teacher and forensics coach, also has been adjunct lecturer in history at Marian University.
