We received \$49,412 in January and February and spent \$46,668. Both giving and spending were under budget. Spending was favorable primarily due to vacant staff positions. Although we have reduced our 2019 budgeted spending, we will be challenged to maintain giving at a level to fund this spending.

GREAT FAMILY ACTIVITY

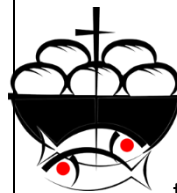
One youth and one adult member are needed to help run the sound booth once a month. Training will be provided.

BOOKS BETWEEN BITES

Books Between Bites meets Tuesday, April 9, 2019 at 12:10 pm. **REZ LIFE: An Indian's Journey Through Reservation Life** by David Treuer.

This book is a gritty, raw and thoroughly authentic look at reservation life from the inside out. Pastor Dawn Helton-Anishinaabegwa, our reviewer, is the pastor at Salem United Methodist Church. She is an enrolled member of the Lac Courte Oreilles Band of Lake Superior Chippewa and the first ordained American Indian elder in the Wisconsin Conference UMC.
